This year, we sadly said goodbye to my beloved father and founding Chair, Raúl César Romero Arzamendi, along with our founding Board member, Delfino Ochoa Ángel. Their vision and dedication were the cornerstone of the creation of Fundación para la Protección de la Niñez, I.A.P.

I deeply appreciate the messages of affection received, which have been a source of comfort and testimonies of the extraordinary impact generated by our dear founders. In the following pages, we pay homage and recognition for the great philanthropic legacy they left to Mexico.

The year summarized in this report represents a milestone in the Foundation's history.

After eight years of dedication, we completed the most significant real estate transaction in our organization's history. Valued at 300 million pesos, this deal will unlock new uses and significantly increase the value of three of our properties.

The rental income generated from these assets will provide sustainable funding to strengthen the organization's impact over the medium and long term.

During this period, we successfully launched and validated our impactful solar energy infrastructure program, which is already delivering significant reductions in electricity costs for the organizations we support. This initiative is set to generate sustained savings over the next 25 years, enabling nonprofits to redirect those funds toward high-

priority programs that expand access to education, healthcare, and other essential services for the communities they serve.

On the fundraising front, we saw substantial growth in cash donations from our strategic partners. We extend special thanks to our long-term donors for their unwavering commitment and collaboration over more than two decades, as well as to those who renewed their dedication to supporting children. We are equally grateful to the new strategic partners with whom we look forward to building strong collaborations to advance our work in the coming years.

Lastly, we deeply appreciate the outstanding legal support we have received, especially the generous and expert pro bono counsel, which has been instrumental in achieving many of the accomplishments highlighted in this report.

None of this would be possible without the dedication of our professional team, the trust of our donors and partners, and a shared vision of protecting childhood and expanding opportunities.

We remain committed to moving forward with responsibility, innovation, and transparency to fulfill our mission.

We witnessed firsthand the power of collective effort, strategic decision-making, and strong partnerships—each link strengthening our impact on the children and youth we serve through the nonprofit organizations we support.

This year, we redoubled our efforts to provide meaningful, tailored support to the organizations that entrust us with their work. We installed solar panels and water heaters at 16 nonprofits, making a significant leap toward energy sustainability. Beyond the environmental benefits, this has resulted in meaningful cost savings, freeing up resources to be reinvested in vital areas like food, healthcare, education, and direct support for children.

Our commitment goes beyond installation; we actively support these organizations in monitoring energy production and measuring financial impact.

Seeing children and youth enjoy safer, brighter, and more dignified spaces powered by clean energy reminds us of the deep human purpose behind every step we take.

We also strengthened our partnership with a higher educational institution to offer scholarships for young people and staff from our partner organizations, opening doors for continued education, degree attainment, and improved English skills. Additionally, we introduced coding workshops for high school students to prepare them for future careers.

All of this reflects the collective dedication of many: the trust of our donors, the collaboration of our partners, the passion of our team, and above all, the resilience and commitment of the organizations we serve. They are the heart and soul of our mission.

As we close this year, we do so with confidence that we are moving forward, step by step, with focus, responsibility, and a deep commitment to Mexico's children. We know the journey ahead is long, but our vision is clear: a country where every child is protected, cared for, and given the opportunity to dream big.

The Smiles Behind the Numbers

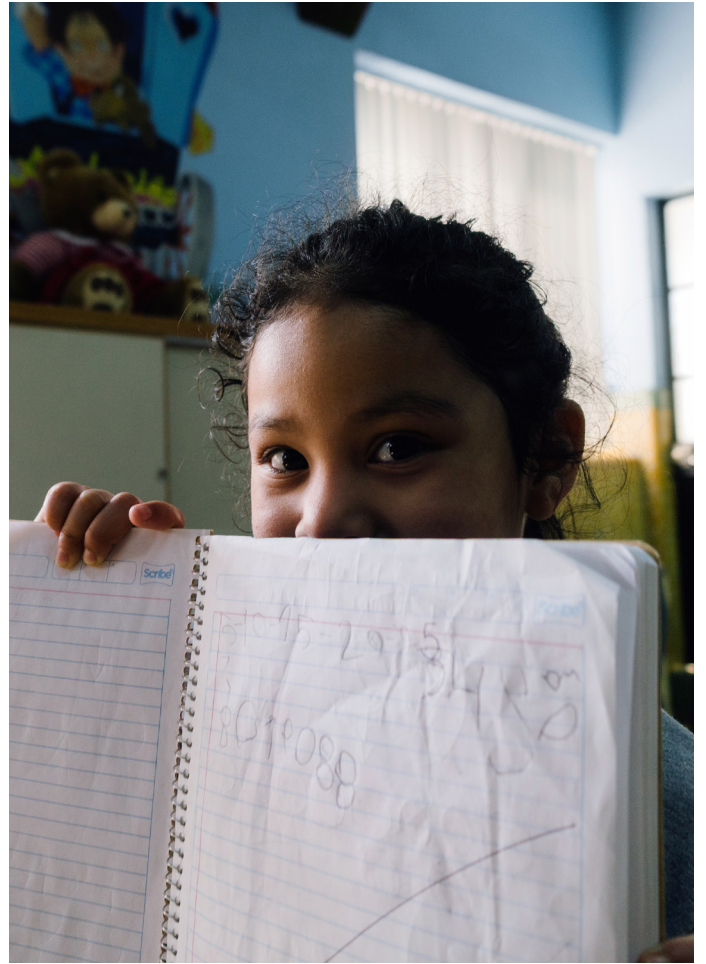


In 2024, we reaffirmed what drives us: putting our hearts into every action and standing shoulder to shoulder with those who need us most.

This year, through close collaboration with **204 nonprofit organizations across 18 Mexican states**, we directly impacted the lives of **85,337 people**. But these aren't just numbers, they are real faces, stories, and dreams that found support, partnership, and a path forward.

Our reach extended from bustling cities to remote, rural communities in **Baja California, Mexico City, Chihuahua, Coahuila, State of Mexico, Guanajuato, Guerrero, Jalisco, Michoacán, Morelos, Nuevo León, Puebla, Querétaro, San Luis Potosí, Sinaloa, Sonora, Tlaxcala, and Veracruz**. Wherever there is childhood, there is hope, and that's exactly where we want to be.

Our approach centers on nonprofit organizations as the true champions on the ground. These dedicated groups work every day with some of the most vulnerable populations, reaching communities facing deep challenges but also immense potential to create positive change.

Every Action Counts

We firmly believe that no one can do it alone. That's why one of our most important strategic pillars is standing alongside and strengthening the organizations that, every day, on the front lines, are changing lives.

We invest our time, heart, and resources in supporting those who dedicate themselves to caring for, educating, and inspiring hope in children, youth, and their families. Here's how we made a difference in 2024:

Solar Energy Infrastructure for Nonprofits

In 2024, we committed to a cleaner, more equitable, and sustainable future. **We invested \$4,978,286 pesos to bring solar energy to 16 nonprofit organizations across eight Mexican states.** We installed **487 solar panels and two solar water heaters**, transforming the way these organizations operate. They're no longer just caring for those who need it most, they're also caring for the planet.

This investment helped reduce their electricity costs, freeing up funds to support other critical needs — while joining the global effort toward sustainability. Because the energy that powers Mexico can come from the sun... and from the heart.

433 solar panels have been installed and are currently undergoing the interconnection process with Mexico's national electric utility, Comisión Federal de Electricidad (CFE), to feed clean energy into the grid.

We ensure the long-term success of our solar energy projects by monitoring energy production around the clock — 24/7, 365 days a year. We track kilowatt hours (kWh) generated in real time, estimate the environmental benefits, and measure the cumulative cost savings achieved by the nonprofit organizations we support.

Thanks to the solar panels, our electricity bill dropped from \$16,708 pesos every two months to just \$110 pesos.

In Kind Donations

In 2024, we delivered donated supplies worth \$31,196,865 pesos to 183 organizations. These included food, clothing, footwear,

hygiene products, and essential materials, helping them continue their work without worrying about urgent needs. This not only lightens their burden but also allows them to focus on what really matters: the people they serve.

• Basic Needs Sustenance

We provided cereals, cleaning products, and personal hygiene supplies worth **\$23,464,578 pesos** guaranteeing more dignified and healthy conditions in **183 nonprofit organizations in 13 states.**

• Infrastructure

We equipped nonprofits with laminated flooring, baseboards, waterproofing, and artificial foliage, totaling **\$7,665,375 pesos**, improving the spaces that serve the most vulnerable..

• Culture, Sports, and Recreation

We provided bicycles to girls and boys from our partner organizations worth **\$66,912 pesos** to support sports and recreation programs.



Donor-Funded Programs

We managed and allocated **\$2,903,477 pesos** in direct financial support from our committed donors and partners. These resources were distributed across the following key impact areas:

- **Infrastructure:** Support for the construction, remodeling, rehabilitation, and equipping of facilities to improve spaces where care and services are provided.
- **Culture, sports and recreational activities:** Funding for recreational and cultural events aimed at strengthening the emotional, cognitive, physical, and social well-being of children and adolescents.
- **Health:** Production and delivery of custom-made wheelchairs for 10 people with severe disabilities, empowering mobility, independence, and dignity.

Strategic Partnerships for Lasting Impact

Through our partnership with **Fundación Inoma**, we expanded access to Tak-Tak-Tak, a digital platform of educational games to three organizations. This initiative reached 400 elementary school students, helping them strengthen their skills in math, Spanish, and science in a fun, interactive way.

A Future With Vision

We invested **\$168,016 pesos** to support **30 elementary and middle school** students through our collaboration with **Club Lía**. This program provided opportunities to build skills in coding, robotics, academic enrichment, and logical thinking using cutting-edge digital tools.

To ensure these students could fully engage in their learning, we also conducted comprehensive vision screenings and provided prescription glasses, directly improving both their academic performance and everyday quality of life.

Partnership with UTEL Universidad

UTEL Universidad Scholarship Charting a Path

UTEL Universidad awarded **8 scholarships, valued at \$185,920 pesos**, so that adolescents and youth in children’s homes could take an online course in digital programming, with emphasis on web development, data science fundamentals, and Python.

UTEL Universidad Scholarship Horizons of Opportunity

UTEL Universidad granted **13 scholarships totaling \$1,804,920 pesos** for online bachelor’s degree studies.

UTEL Universidad Scholarship English

UTEL Universidad offered **10 scholarships worth \$270,000 pesos** so that youth and adults could improve their English.

Each number represents a story, a smile, a possibility. And that is exactly what we seek: to transform realities, one step at a time, with many hands united.



Building the Future from the Inside Out

• Emergency Response in Guerrero

In partnership with World Vision México, we extended support to vulnerable communities in high-need areas of Guerrero. Thanks to the solidarity of Henkel Consumer Brands, we donated over 73,000 essential hygiene products to bring relief and dignity to families facing crisis.

• Mobilizing Support Through Events

With the generous collaboration of Eventos Bajo Par and Paraíso Country Club, we hosted our 2nd Annual Golf Tournament, raising critical funds and expanding awareness of our mission.

• Promoting Inclusion and Mobility

In partnership with Colgate, we donated \$100,000 pesos to provide wheelchairs to the Organización Internacional Vida Independiente para Personas con Discapacidad, A.C., enhancing mobility and autonomy for individuals with disabilities

• Engaging in Advocacy and Leadership Spaces

We contributed to national conversations on social change by participating in the Civil Society Advisory Committee of the 2nd Transformational Leadership Congress for Social Change, organized by Tecnológico de Monterrey.

• Coordinating In-Kind Donations

We facilitated the donation of bicycles to children's homes—encouraging recreation, movement, and joy for children in our partner organizations

• Welcoming New Donors

We were honored to receive support from Grupo Bimbo and McKinsey & Company Inc. México, expanding the network of partners aligned with our mission.

• Confirmed Grant from Smiths Group Foundation

We are grateful to confirm a grant from the Smiths Group Foundation, further strengthening our ability to reach those who need us most.



Corporate Hands, Shared Purpose

In 2024, 147 corporate volunteers joined forces with us to create meaningful experiences that supported the emotional well-being, sense of belonging, and physical environment of hundreds of children and youth. These efforts were made possible through impactful partnerships with socially responsible companies and organizations.

- **Backpacks and Smiles Powered by Energy.** In collaboration with Fundación Sempra Infraestructura, A.C., we led two initiatives: “Carga una mochila de energía” and “Carga una sonrisa de energía”, where volunteers delivered school supplies, clothing, and toys, bringing renewed hope to children during the back-to-school season and holiday celebrations.

- **Creating Safe, Joyful Spaces in Querétaro.** Volunteers from Kellanova enhanced Casa Hogar San Pablo, I.A.P. by painting facilities, installing safety nets, and sharing quality time with the children, fostering both safety and joy.

- **Revitalizing Rural Education in Guanajuato.** With the support of Colgate-Palmolive, volunteers improved the rural school “Enseñanza” by installing a water tank, painting classrooms, cleaning, and planting trees, creating a healthier, more welcoming environment for students.

- **Wellness and Fun in Monterrey.** Young girls from Orientación Social Femenina de Monterrey, A.C. enjoyed a special day focused on dental health and recreation at Parque Amazonia, thanks to Colgate-Palmolive’s continued support.

- **Aquatic Adventures in Guadalajara.** Children from Ministerios de Amor, A.C. explored the Michin Aquarium, learning and laughing in a space full of wonder and joy, an unforgettable experience made possible by generous volunteers.

- **Renewing Spaces in Mérida.** Volunteers came together at El Renacer del Mayab, A.C., where they renovated classrooms, cleaned green areas, and rehabilitated outdoor spaces using compacted fill, creating a more welcoming and functional environment for children and staff.

- **A Fresh Coat of Hope in the State of Mexico.** At the Fundación de Apoyo al Débil Mental, A.C., dedicated team members from UTEL Universidad painted three classrooms, leaving behind not just brighter walls, but a lasting sense of care and community.

Each brushstroke, each tree planted, every shared smile, and act of service speaks to the power of philanthropy in action, showing how small efforts, when done together, can transform lives and uplift entire communities.

Investing in Permanence:

Real Estate with Purpose

In 2024, our Foundation completed a major real estate operation valued at \$300 million pesos, involving three properties in Mexico City, one located on Av. Insurgentes Sur and two in Coyoacán.

This strategic investment will generate

long-term income from real estate rentals, ensuring a steady source of funding to expand our impact. By optimizing the use of these assets, we are creating a sustainable path to increase support for vulnerable children and youth—today and for generations to come.

We manage every peso entrusted to us with care, transparency, and a deep sense of responsibility. Our accounting and finance team maintains strict oversight of all incoming and outgoing funds, and our financial statements are audited annually by independent external auditors.
